



Sentence Rearrangement

Definition:

Sentence rearrangement is the process of **reordering words, phrases, or clauses** to form a **meaningful and grammatically correct sentence**. It's a common exercise in language learning to improve grammar, vocabulary, and logical thinking.

Types of Sentence Rearrangement:

1. Rearranging jumbled words to form a sentence
 2. Rearranging jumbled sentences to form a paragraph
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1. Rearranging Jumbled Words (Word Order Correction)

Example 1:

- **Jumbled:** cake / delicious / a / baked / she
- **Correct:** *She baked a delicious cake.*

Example 2:

- **Jumbled:** park / they / in / playing / are / the
 - **Correct:** *They are playing in the park.*
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2. Rearranging Sentences to Form a Paragraph

You are given multiple sentences in random order, and you must arrange them in a **logical and coherent sequence**.

Example:

Jumbled Sentences:

1. He picked it up and took it home.
2. Rahul saw a small puppy on the street.
3. He gave it food and water.
4. The puppy was weak and hungry.

Correct Order: 2 → 1 → 4 → 3

Rahul saw a small puppy on the street. He picked it up and took it home. The puppy was weak and hungry. He gave it food and water.



Tips to Solve Sentence Rearrangement:

- Identify the **subject** and **main idea** first.
 - Look for **linking words** (then, however, because, etc.).
 - Watch out for **chronological order** (what happened first).
 - Use **articles and pronouns** to guide order (e.g., *a book* → *the book*).
 - Try **elimination** if it's a multiple-choice question.

✓ **Final Paragraph:**

The children went on a picnic. They got lost in the forest. They were scared and started crying. Finally, a ranger found them and helped them.
