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# Technological Determinism in Social Media

# Critiques of Technological Determinism

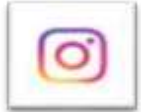
- Critics argue that technological determinism overlooks the role of human agency. While technology influences behavior and society, humans shape and use technology according to their needs, values, and goals.
