LOGICAL SEQUENCE OF WORDS

A logical sequence of words refers to the arrangement of a set of words in a specific order that makes sense based on their relationship to one another. This relationship can be based on various factors, such as:

- Chronological order: Arranging events in the order they occur in time.
- **Spatial order:** Arranging objects or places based on their physical location.
- **Hierarchical order:** Arranging items based on their level of importance or authority.
- Causal order: Arranging events based on cause and effect.
- Conceptual order: Arranging ideas or concepts based on their logical progression.
