

Cause and effect

Here's a breakdown of cause and effect:

1. **Cause:** This is the factor or event that produces an effect. It is the reason or catalyst behind a particular outcome. Causes can be complex and multifaceted, involving various factors.
 - Comes first
 - Tells - why
2. **Effect:** This is the result or outcome produced by a cause. It is the consequence of a particular action or event. Effects can be immediate or delayed, and they can lead to further consequences in a chain reaction.
 - Comes next to cause
 - Tells- what happened

Example- 1

Identify the cause and effect in the given sentence

1. George was angry, so he went for a walk.
 - Cause: George was angry.
 - Effect: He went for a walk.
2. Yasmine ate a peanut butter sandwich because she was hungry.
 - Cause: Yasmine was hungry.
 - Effect: She ate a peanut butter sandwich.
3. Jill got in the pool because it was so hot.
 - Cause: It was so hot.
 - Effect: Jill got in the pool.
4. The cat, who was thirsty, stopped at the water bowl.
 - Cause: The cat was thirsty.
 - Effect: The cat stopped at the water bowl.

Example- 2

Identify the cause and effect in the given sentence

1. Mike missed the bus, so he had to walk to school.
 - Cause: Mike missed the bus.
 - Effect: He had to walk to school.
2. Lily forgot her umbrella, and it started raining during her walk.
 - Cause: Lily forgot her umbrella.
 - Effect: It started raining during her walk.
3. The alarm clock didn't go off, making Emily late for work.
 - Cause: The alarm clock didn't go off.
 - Effect: Emily was late for work.
4. Because of the heavy traffic, Mark arrived at the meeting after it had started.
 - Cause: Heavy traffic.
 - Effect: Mark arrived at the meeting after it had started.
5. Sophia received a promotion because of her hard work and dedication.
 - Cause: Sophia's hard work and dedication.
 - Effect: She received a promotion.
6. The ice cream melted because the freezer stopped working.
 - Cause: The freezer stopped working.
 - Effect: The ice cream melted.
